RESOLUTION

Payment of Monetary Relief to the victims of atrocities on members of the Scheduled Castes & Scheduled Tribes and their family members has so far been regulated as per the Resolution No.PCR-93/2003-402/SSD Dt.07.01.2004 & No.PCR-4/2012/SSD Dt.28.06.2012 in terms of the Scheduled Castes & Scheduled Tribes (Prevention of Atrocities) Rules,1995 and the Scheduled Castes & Scheduled Tribes (Prevention of Atrocities) (Amendment) Rules,2011respectively.

(i) Consequent upon enactment of the Scheduled Castes & Scheduled Tribes (Prevention of Atrocities) (Amendment) Rules, 2014 vide Gazette Notification Dt. 23. 06.2014, published in Gazette of India vide G.S.R. No.416 (E) dtd.23.06.2014, the enhanced scale of relief has been prescribed.

(ii) Now, Government after careful consideration have been pleased to adopt the said enhanced scale of relief for the victims of atrocities belonging to Scheduled Castes & Scheduled Tribes as per norms and scale prescribed in the schedule annexed to the said amendment Rules.

(iii) This will effect from 23.06.2014 i.e. Gazette Notification No. 331 Dt. 23 06.2014, published in Gazette of India

(iv) The details norms for relief amount are furnished hereunder:-
