Proceedings of the Review Meeting held on 19.04.2021 at 3.30.PM under the Chairmanship of DC cum ACS, Odisha on important issues concerning implementation of FRA.

A meeting to review important issues on implementation of Forest Rights Act & its corresponding Rules was held under the Chairmanship of the DC cum ACS, Odisha on 19.04.2021 at 3.30 PM through virtual mode, wherein Principal Secretary, ST & SC Dev. Dept., Principal Secretary, Revenue & DM Deptt, Director, ST, SSD, Director, Panchayati Raj, PR & DW Deptt., Dy. Conservator, Office of the PCCF, Odisha, Officer on Special Duty, (SSD), Collectors cum Chairperson, DLCs on FRA, DFOs and District level Nodal Officers on FRA had attended. As per the agenda of the meeting, following issues were discussed and decisions taken:

<u>Disposal of pending rejected Individual Forest Rights by the DLCs concerned, as per</u> the submission made before the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India

As per the compliance affidavit filed during July, 2019 before the Hon'ble Supreme Court in W.P (C) no.109/2008 by the Chief Secretary, Odisha, out of the total 1,41,471 IFR claims rejected, 13,851 IFR claims were finally rejected by the DLCs concerned and 1,27,620 were pending for review, which ought to have been completed by March,2020. But till the end of March 2021, only 65,161 claims have been disposed by the DLCs concerned leaving a balance of another 62,459 numbers of claims pending for disposal. On going through the district wise pendency attached as **Annexure-1**, it is noted that the bulk of pendency (45,438) which accounts for 72%, relates to 5 districts & those are namely. Sundargarh, Sambalpur, Nuapara, Jharsuguda and Deogarh. All concerned Collectors cum Chairperson of DLCs on FRA were impressed upon to expedite disposal of the pending rejected IFR claims at the earliest possible by following the procedures laid down under the Amended Forest Rights Rules, 2012 and report compliance by the end of June, 2021. DC cum ACS requested all concerned authorities to ensure that while disposing those rejected IFR claims, no genuine claimant is deprived of his forest rights bestowed through this benevolent legislation.

Prompt & Expeditious disposal of pending claims

Till the end of March, 2021, out of 6,41,378 forest rights claims received in the State of Odisha (6,26,305 IFR & 15,073 CR), 4,51,982 titles have been distributed (4,45,105 IFR & 6,877CR), 79,303 claims were rejected (78,299 IFR & 1004 CR) and 1,10,093 were pending (102901 IFR & 7192 CR) at various level for consideration & disposal. Out of it, 10,827 (8239 IFR & 2588 CR) are noted to be pending even after approval by the DLCs concerned. District wise data for individual claims and community claims are shown at Annexure-2A & Annexure-2B respectively. District Collectors were requested to ensure distribution of the approved claims by the end of May, 2021 and clear up the pendency by convening SDLCs and DLC on periodical basis. They were also requested to mobilize Community Rights (CR) claims and specifically Community Forest Resources (CFR) rights claims provided under Section 3 (1) (i) of the FRA, as per the potential communicated vide letter No.16416/SSD dt. 03.09.2016 of the ST & SC Dev Department. In this connection, provisions enumerated under rule 12 B (3) and (4) of the amended Forest Rights Rules. 2012 needs to be followed scrupulously.

Conversion of forest villages, un-surveyed villages / habitations etc. into Revenue villages.

Section 3(1) (h) of the FRA, 2006 provides that all forest villages, un-surveyed habitations and old habitations etc. need to be converted into "Revenue Village"; As per Census 2001 data, there were about 589 habitations (zero area) located on the Forest land & 20 are recorded Forest Villages. R&DM Department has issued elaborative guideline detailing the process to be adopted for conversion of the Forest villages, un-surveyed habitations etc. into revenue villages vide letter no.3831/RDM Dt.02.02.2017. District wise status of it is indicated in Annexure-3, which reveals that 67 such habitations have already been converted to Revenue villages prior to the enactment of FRA, 2006 and 529 numbers have been identified, out of which 152 applications have been received and 12 such villages/habitations have been declared as 'Revenue Villages' by the Board of Revenue under the Survey and Settlement Act. Since 11 out of those 12 villages relates to Dhenkanal district only, Collector, Dhenkanal & the Collector, Sundargarh (Ex- Collector, Dhenkanal during whose incumbency the process was adopted on Mission Mode) were requested to come up with a document on "Conversion process of Forest / Un-surveyed villages. habitations etc. into Revenue Villages" adopted during the conversion exercise in Dhenkanal district, so that other districts could learn & replicate it in their districts and complete this important task smoothly. DC cum ACS also requested for the involvement of NGOs / CSOs in such exercise to expedite the process.

Correction of RoR/Maps in respect of the titles vested with the claimants

Correction of RoRs and Maps of the forest land vested with the claimants is a statutory requirement as per the provisions provided under rule 12 A (9) of the amended FR Rules, 2012. R & DM Department has already issued detail guidelines in this regard vide its letter No.44430/R&DM dated 10.12.2018. Even training & orientation of concerned field officials & particularly those of Tahasildars, Sub-Collectors, DWOs, PA, ITDAs etc have also been imparted during the year 2019. As per the reports received from the districts, out of 4,51,982 forest rights titles distributed in the State till the end of March, 2021, demarcations of 3,76,830 (83%) titles and RoR/ Map corrections of 2,20,636 (48%) titles only have been made. District wise status on demarcation and RoR/map correction are indicated in the statement attached as Annexure-4. DC cum ACS urged upon the Collectors to ensure completion of demarcation as well as RoR/Map correction process at the earliest in a time bound manner as mere distribution of the titles would be of no use to the right holders. RoR correction and supply of a copy of it to the right holder is to be ensured for true realization of the benefit extended to those families. Hosting of the RoRs in the BHULEKH portal is also to be ensured. He instructed the Collectors to review & monitor the process on a fortnightly basis & also to incorporate it in the agenda of the monthly revenue meetings.

Coverage of FRA title holders under different schemes/ programs of the Govt.

Out of 4,45,105 IFR titles distributed to the eligible claimants in Odisha till March,2021, post claim support as envisaged under rule 16 of the amended FRA Rules, 2012 have been extended to only 2,66,073 (59%) title holders. District wise status on convergence of schemes and programs is shown at **Annexure-5**. Director, ST apprised that in obedience of the instruction of the DC cum ACS in the review meeting held on 18.02.2021, a format to capture details of the FRA title holders benefitted under different programs has already

been shared with the districts. In the meantime, only few districts have provided the requisite information in the specified format and requested to ensure its submission to the Department at the earliest possible. All Collectors were urged upon to look into the matter of coverage of FR title holders under food security and various livelihood promotion schemes of the Government. DC cum ACS stressed on providing pucca housing for all eligible FR title holders along with sanitation and drinking water facilities therein. He also suggested to develop an integrated plan for livelihood promotion of each Forest Right title holding families, wherein schemes and programs of Horticulture Department, Fisheries & Animal Husbandry Dept., Odisha Livelihood Mission etc. should be converged for the overall development of the right holders.

Other Important decisions taken:

- i. Instructions have been issued by the SSD Department for constitution of 160 FRA Cells at the Tahasil, Sub-Division and District level in the 14 ST populated districts. wherein a Coordinator and a DEO are to be engaged to fast track the implementation of FRA. As ascertained from the district level Nodal Officers, engagement of staff have been completed in 92 such Cells and the process in rest is at final stages. All Collectors to ensure its proper functioning and may dovetail its functioning with the assistances of good NGOs/ CSOs functioning in their districts.
- ii. Since the Collectors are involved in multifarious important activities such as tackling Covid-19 Pandemic, law & Order situations, implementation of various welfare & developmental schemes and programs of the government, so as the Chairperson of the DLC on FRA, their role in the effective implementation of FRA has been worked out and attached herein as **Annexure-6**, which would help them to monitor the implementation of FRA effectively.
- iii. Odisha is regarded as one of the best States in the implementation of FRA as it has distributed the highest number of forest rights titles in the Country and its rejection rate is also much below the national average. So to highlight its achievement, success stories & good practices on FRA implementation needs to be collected from each district and documented for its replication. Districts Collectors were requested to ensure its documentation with good pictures and send it to the SSD Department for its consolidation, dissemination and wide publicity.
- iv. Information sought in the prescribed format vide SSD Department's letter No.20923/SSD dated 03.12.2019 as regard details of the claimants, whose claims have been finally rejected by the DLCs concerned and the details of the forest land involved needs to be submitted to the SSD Department at an early date and preferably by 15.05.2021, so that those could be shared with ORSAC to derive the geo-referenced polygons and its eventual submission to the Forest Survey of India for the satellite survey exercise of the land parcels of the rejected claimants in obedience to the direction of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India passed on 13.02.2019 and 28.02.2019 in WP(C) no.109/2008.

The meeting then ended with a Vote of thanks to the Chair and all the participants.

Role of Collector cum Chairperson, DLC on FRA for its effective & expeditious implementation

- Fast track the review of pending IFR claims to be disposed by following the provisions enumerated under FRA & the Amended Rules,2012 and as reiterated in SSD Deptt.'s letter No.7984/SSD dt.29.04.2019 and No.13581/SSD Dt.08.08.2019.
- Collect & consolidate the details of the IFR claimants along with the forest land rejected by the DLC & ensure its communication to the SSD Department at the earliest to derive the digital geo-referenced polygons through ORSAC and its eventual submission to FSI for satellite survey exercise.
- Ensure support of credible NGOs/CSOs at the district/ Sub-district level so that all projected & probable forest right claims are filed at the GS level within a definite time frame & are disposed-of as per the provisions laid down so that FRA implementation arrives on a saturation mode.
- Ensure demarcation of the forest land vested with the claimants & correction of RoRs/Maps of all the FR titles distributed in a time bound manner and its hosting in the Bhulekh portal as well as supply of a copy of the same to the claimant concerned.
- Ensure full coverage of the Forest Rights title holders under different welfare & livelihood promotion schemes as per the provisions enumerated under rule 16 of the amended rules, 2012.
- Formulate strategies for identification & conversion of all forest villages, un-surveyed villages/ habitations etc. into revenue villages by following the guidelines issued by the R & DM Department vide its letter No.3831/R&DM dt.02.02.2017.
- Monitor the implementation of FRA on a regular basis by incorporating the same in the agenda of monthly revenue meetings.
- In the Scheduled districts, constitution & proper functioning of FRA cells at the Tahasil, Sub-Division and district level to be ensured.
